In September, after the course enrollment, students will choose the TFM and supervisor according to their academic grades from the first year of the Master's.

Students, independently, will have enough time to carry out all activities required for the elaboration of the TFM, using materials and resources recommended by their supervisors.

5.2.Learning tasks

The course includes the following learning tasks:

- In September, after the enrollment period, there will be an explanatory class. The Master's coordinator will present the TFM guidelines and will clarify any questions that students may have.
- TFM-related tutorials should be scheduled by students and supervisors, and can be individual, in group or virtual. In tutorials, students will solve specific questions about the activities being developed regarding the TFM, and the supervisors will review and evaluate the progress made by the students.
